The three projects Rural Self-help Development Association (RSDA), Development of Peace Education (DPE), and Berea Agricultural Group (BAG) that we have worked on for quite some years continue. However the DPE project will finish soon. Here DLN wants to say congratulation to DPE and the DPE-group. A new project is granted from CISU. It will last three years and the amount is around 3 million Danish kr. The project among other things is to develop digital libraries in the districts so knowledge can be shared quickly.

De 3 projekter med Rural Selfhelp Development Association (RSDA), Development of Peace Education (DPE) og Berea Agricultural Group (BAG), som vi har haft i gang i flere år, kører fortsat. DPE-projektet slutter dog snart. Her må vi sige tillykke til både DPE og DPE-gruppen. CISU har bevilliget en ny tre-årig periode og omkring 3 millioner kr. til bl.a. at udvikle digitale biblioteker ude i distrikterne, så viden hurtigt kan opsamles og deles.

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The RSDA project will run for another year and so will the BAG project. It is therefore good news that a new project is shaping up together with Lesotho National Council of Women (LNCW). It will be interesting to follow the new projects.

Board Secretary Carsten Brønden visited Lesotho for one week at the end of April. The purpose was to establish a firmer foundation for our cooperation with LNCW. The aim of this cooperation is to support capacity development at LNCW's vocational schools that offer training to poor young people. Carsten's travel expenses were covered from DLNs own sources, while the school/LNCW provided food and transport for participants in meetings and workshops. Carsten describes the visit to Maseru as very successful. Both LNCW and the school are very interested in starting the cooperation, and there is full appreciation of who we are in DLN and what we can do. Also that we are not a donor, but that we can facilitate the process of obtaining funds for relevant activities. Carsten and the project group will now prepare an application to CISU together with LNCW for funding of agreed training activities. This will be under CISU's 'Citizen Participation' window (for small projects), where applications received and assessed currently.

Anne Andersen and Lisbeth Kristensen from the travel group have conducted research in Lesotho in preparation of the Culture Travel scheduled for November this year.

Appointments and bookings have been made regarding accommodation, transport, visits and activities during the tour. It is still possible to join this event, which is limited to 20 participants. Der er fuld forståelse for, hvem DLN er, og hvad vi kan. Også at vi ikke er en donor, men at vi vil være behjælpelige med at søge at fremskaffe midler til relevante aktiviteter. Carsten og projektgruppen går sammen med nøglepersoner i LNCW i gang med at udarbejde en ansøgning til CISU om støtte til gennemførelse af planlagte kursusaktiviteter under CISU's nye 'lille vindue', som har løbende ansøgningsfrist.

Herhjemme havde vi igen hørt om et valg til Parlamentet i utide, og jeg var usikker på, hvad



The range of activities has also been extended; mountain bikes can be rented and local guides are ready to take us hiking, either walking or on horseback.

In Upper Moyeni, Quthing I visited 'Maneo. She showed me her home, her garden and her catering company. Maneo is certainly an active lady, who has managed to get many things up and running over the past 10 years.



DPE Coordinator Sofonea Shale described to me that he wanted a modern, expandable website connected with the DPE's social media platforms. He was also interested in having a map on the website showing the locations of DPE activities inspired by the cisu.dk world map.

A new website had recently been developed by a local company but had seemed lackluster

Personlig on-line assistance til DPE

Jeg havde fået til opgaveat sikre, at DPEs nye hjemmeside livede op til DPEs ønsker.

DPE coordinator, Sofonea Shale, forklarede mig, at han ønskede en moderne hjemmeside, der kunne udvides, og som var forbundet til DPEs sociale medie platforme. Med inspiration fra cisu.dks verdenskort, var han også interesseret i have et kort på hjemmesiden, som viste hvor DPE har aktiviteter.



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when I initially inspected it. With the help of Sesale "Godfrey" Masike, DPE's newly appointed webmaster, I analyzed the status and usability of the site.

We quickly concluded that the existing website was not worth attempting to repair.

- There was no discernable Content Management System, which would be hopelessly backward.
- The website would redirect to various malicious sites including pornography on mobile devices.
- Large sections of content where missing pages were unreachable due to errors in code.

Instead we decided that we would use Wordpress, one of the most used Content Management Systems worldwide. Quick, flexible, expandable, secure and well documented.

Working side by side we set up a Wordpress installation on a subsection of the existing DPE website and recovered any old content that we could.

I would run Godfrey through an action such as copying a page by first doing it while explaining my actions and then by observing as he handled the next page. There are a lot of things to remember in this work and I was deeply impressed with how quickly Godfrey was able to pick up the details and utilize the methods I explained to him.

Within the first day of work we had fully replicated the original sites available data and on the second day of work we felt comfortable replacing the original site with our new version. This was quickly accomplished, eliminating the malicious redirects.

We moved on to improve the visuals of the site, adding new features and recreating the lost

En ny hjemmeside var for nylig blevet udviklet af et lokalt firma, men den forekom mig temmelig kedelig, da jeg kiggede på den. Med hjælp fra Sesale "Godfrey" Masike, DPE's nyligt udnævnte webmaster, analyserede jeg hjemmesidens status og brugbarhed. Vi kom hurtigt til den konklusion, at det ikke var umagen værd at forsøge at reparere hjemmesiden.

Der var tilsyneladende ikke noget system for styring af indholdet, hvilket forekommer håbløst forældet.

Hjemmesiden omdirigerer brugeren til 'ondsindede' hjemmesider, herunder pornografi på mobile enheder.

Store indholdssektioner var utilgængelige, fordi der var fejl i koderne.

Vi besluttede derfor, at vi ville bruge Wordpress, som er et af verdens mest brugte Content Management Systems (Indholdsstyresystemer). Hurtigt, flexibelt, udvidelsesparat, sikkert og veldokumenteret.

Sammen installerede vi Wordpress på en underafdeling af den eksisterende DPE hjemmeside og reddede alt det gamle materiale, vi kunne.

Jeg demonstrerede for Godfrey, for eksempel hvordan man kan kopiere en side, alt imens jeg forklarede, hvad jeg gjorde. Dernæst observede jeg, mens han prøve den næste side. Der er



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sections of the website such as the personnel page. Whenever possible, we would focus on technical challenges and defer the creation of content to a later date, reasoning that content could always be added at a later stage without my direct assistance.

Towards the end of the project I focused on the map feature while Godfrey gathered content for the website and map. To create the map I bought a popular map plugin for Wordpress where we could show the districts of Lesotho and have them lead to maps of that district with markers for the CBOs (Community based organizations) within the area.

In the end we were able to give the DPE a modern website fitting their vision, Godfrey learned a lot about Wordpress and Ntate Shale got the map he wanted.

virkelig meget, man skal huske under dette arbejde, og jeg var dybt imponeret over, hvor hurtigt Godfrey forstod detaljerne og kunne bruge de metoder, jeg viste ham.

I løbet af den første fik vi kopieret alle tilgængelige data fra de gamle sider, og på anden dagen følte vi os klar til at erstatte den originale side med vores nye version. Det var hurtigt klaret, og de 'ondsindede' omdirigeringer var fjernet.

Vi gik videre med at forbedre sidens billedmateriale og tilføje nye emner, samt genskabe tabte sektioner såsom personale siden. Hvor det var muligt, fokuserede vi på de tekniske udfordringer og udsatte udarbejdelsen af indhold til senere, idet ny indhold altid kan tilføjes senere uden min assistance.

Mod slutningen koncentrerede jeg mig om 'kort'-faciliteten, mens Godfrey samlede indhold til siden og kortet. Til at lave kortet købte jeg en populær kort 'plugin' til Wordpress, hvor vi kunne vise alle Lesothos distrikter, hvor man så kan 'klikke' videre til kort med markører for Community Based Organisations (CBO'er) indenfor området.

Vi fik altså lavet en DPE hjemmeside, der passer til organisations vision, Godfrey fik lært en masse om Wordpress og Ntate Shale fik det kort, han ønskede.

The first visit was to the farm owned by chief and chairman of RSDA Mr. Leutloileng Matsepe in Mafeteng. He has a very versatile farm. His herd consists of 14 cattle, including twin calves for fast fattening with fodder (Lucerne bales) from South Africa. He also had South African breed of pigs (1 sow, 6 piglets and 2 pigs for slaughter) sheep, geese, chicken and rabbits.

But unfortunately, the whole area of Mafeteng was marked by draught and everyone wished for rain. Mr. Leutloileng Matsepe is chief of the village, a position he inherited from his farther. He was only 10 years old, when his farther passed away, so his mother had to take charge during the years when he did his engineering studies in Swaziland and Bloomfontein. The job of a chief is very wide-

Først var vi inviteret til et bedræftsbesøg hos høvding og formand for RSDA, Mr. Leutloileng Matsepe i Mafeteng. Han har et særdeles alsidigt landbrug. Besætningen var på 14 stk. kvæg, heraf et sæt tvillingekalve til hurtigt opfeding med foder(lucerneballer) fra Sydafrika. Han havde også sydafrikansk landrace grise (1 so, 6 smågrise og 2 slagtesvin), får, gæs, kyllinger og kaniner. Men hele området ved Mafeteng bar desværre præg af tørke, og alle håbede på regn. Mr. Leutloileng Matsepe er høvding for landsbyen, et hverv man overtager fra sin far. Han var kun 10 år da hans far døde, så hans mor løftede opgaven i de år, hvor han blev uddannet ingenjør i hhv. Swaziland og Bloemfontein. Høvdingearbejdet er meget alsidigt. Det omfatter stort set alle forhold, hvor der kan opstå tvist/konflikter mellem mennesker, både i familien og mellem naboer. Her skal høvdingen mægle og træffe beslutning. En dygtig og respekteret høvding er afgørende for trivsel og fredelighed i landsbyen. Det er også høvdingen, der skal inddrive skat. Hvis folk er i restance, så har høvdingen plads til at opbevare en ko eller flere som sikkerhed for gælden.

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ranging and comprises more or less all issues where disagreements and conflicts between people can arise, be it within the families or between neighbours. The chief must mediate and make decisions in all such cases. A clever and respected chief is crucial for the well-being and peace in the village. The chief is also in charge of collecting taxes. If someone is in arrears the chief has the capacity to store a cow or two as security for the debt.

RSDA's hatchery and poultry demonstration farm in Mafeteng is a success story. Mampho Thulo, director of RSDA, showed us the farm and explained about the poultry project. RSDA started the project in 2014 when an egg hatching machine was purchased and has managed to start a production of egg laying hens. RSDA can deliver day-old chicks for fattening to farmers. At the same time RSDA is generating an income from sales of surplus eggs or fattening of surplus chicks. The daily production is ca. 130 eggs in summer and ca. 180 during winter. Fodder is grown in separate 'kitchen gardens'. RSDA employs 3 people at the hatchery, one manager and two assistants. The manager earns 6.300 Maloti per months, and the assistants 2.900 Maloti incl. pension.

The whole poultry farm is built as a demonstration unit and evolves around the concept of educating/training farmers, primarily women, in poultry farming. They are trained in checking of eggs, checking for cockerel or hen, fertilised egg or not, the life

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stages of a chicken within the egg, fattening and chicken, looking after egg layers, and growing of fodder for hens and chicken. All with the purpose of enabling each woman/farmer to become self-reliant with egg and meat, or establish their own business selling eggs or chicken for fattening. Moreover, RSDA is also training on how to start a business by investing in an egg hatching machine and subsequent sales of day-old chicken. Mampho Thulo explains with some pride that RSDA has facilitated the establishment of 10 such hatcheries in Lesotho, and that local people have been trained and enabled to service the hatching machines, so that there is no longer a need to call for service personnel from South Africa. In other words another exemplary indication of the good work carried out by RSDA.

The poultry farm is also a source of income for RSDA through sales of surplus egg and chicken. The current price for one day-old chicken is 10 Maloti fertilized eggs 6 Maloti and eggs for eating is 1,5 Maloti each. MaMaria whom we met at the RSDA office in Maseru was one member of a group of 14 women in a ERFA group. (*The concept is called 'ERFA' in Danish and is widely used within agriculture in Denmark. It consists of a group of typically 4 to 10 farmers who meet regularly to share experiences and results. A consultant leads the meetings, which can deal with any issue considered important, i.e. crops,*

MaMaria som vi mødte på RSDAs kontor i Maseru, var en af 14 kvinder i en ERFAgruppe i Maseru (*ERFA er meget brugt i landbrugskredse i Danmark og betyder ERFAringsudveksling, typisk samler man grupper af 4 til 10 landmænd med en konsulent som mødeleder, deler hinandens erfaringer og resultater, lige fra planteavl, husdyrproduktion, økonomi og sociale forhold*). Hun har etableret en kyllingeproduktion. Hun opdrættede 200 kyllinger ad gangen. Kyllingerne er salgsklare til slagtning efter 42 dage og sælges levende. Tilsammen producerede de 14 kvinder 2800 kyllinger. Kyllingefodret indkøbes i Maseru. Salgsprisen er 70 Maloti for een slagtekla kylling. Læs

MaMaria has established a chicken production business where she grows 200 chickens at a time. The chickens are ready for slaughter after 42 days and are sold alive. The 14 women produce 2800 chicken totally. Fodder is bought in Maseru and the current selling price is 70 Maloti per chicken. (read also the article in the Jubilee magazine about Mapotsane, a woman who has become self-sufficient with eggs for the family thanks to the RSDA initiative).

The RSDA poultry farm is not connected to the grid, so electrical power for the hatching machine has to come from a generator that runs 24 hours a day. Grid connection to substitute the generator would increase the reliability of the hatching machine and reduce the running

The farmers' markets are supported and promoted under the Project "Improving living conditions and position of the Lesotho smallholder farmers in society through lobbying and advocacy and capacity. The project aims at ensuring that at least 1000 smallholder farmers are exposed to viable agricultural practices, benefit from market linkages and are able to graduate from subsistence farming to semi-commercial status. Through the farmers' market, farmers are able sell and engage with business and access new markets.



Nice and sweet

The first day of the market was kick started with 22 farmers and the first day started slowly with poor attendance of the potential buyers, but the second day was wonderful and by the end of the second they had collectively sold products amounting to 30,000 Maloti. The farmers were selling grains-beans, poultry products, sheep and pigs, animal feed, honey, fresh produce - sweet peppers, potatoes, chillies, green mealies, tomatoes, flowers, dried fruits and hand-crafts and others. They also got contacts and orders to supply on off market days. Farmers were able to get immediate

Bønderne solgte korn, bønner, fjerkræprodukter, peberfrugter, kartofler, chili, grønne majs, tomater, blomster, tørrede frugter, kunsthåndværk og andet. De fik også kontakt og ordrer på levering udenfor markedsdagene. Bønderne fik umiddelbare reaktioner fra køberne og fik også ideer til nye produkter, som måske kan sælges på kommende messer og markeder.

feedback from the buyers and received new product ideas which could help in the coming trade fairs/farmers' market.

On reflecting on the market day, the farmers are very happy to see they can organize such an event. They also acknowledge the fact that they heavily relied mainly on the farmer leadership/organizers and as such things didn't go smoothly. The major challenge identified was the issue of market location which is one of the main factors in marketing plan, which if fixed on time will help attract more buyers and help farmers in their planning especially in their budgeting for their participation. Most farmers indicated they could have brought a large variety of their produce if transport was organized properly. Even those that managed to sell, it was sadly to cover the transportation costs thereby reducing the profits which they could have otherwise made. The issue of pricing was raised as a major challenge and set back as the farmers could not set attractive prices for the event. The follow up training of farmers was proposed by the forum, whose aim is to capacitate the farmers on costing and pricing.

The main lesson learnt is to fully commit their efforts as the forum in organizing the future farmers' market. It is therefore highly recommended that in organizing future farmers' market, the all farmers should be highly involved to ensure success and avoid mistakes made in this event. In the future more resources will be committed towards promoting the event to ensure that all parties involved in market participate namely farmers, traders, regulators, suppliers and so on.

The project supported the farmers' forum with facilitating meetings, publicity through media and promotion material, tents and training.

De erkender også, at de var dybt afhængige af landbrugsorganisationerne og organisatorerne, og at tingene ikke bare gik helt glat. Den største udfordring var placeringen af markedet, hvilket er en af de vigtigste faktorer i markedsføringen. Selv for dem der lykkedes med at sælge godt, gjorde transportomkostningerne et stort indhug i deres fortjeneste. Prisfastsættelsen blev også efterfølgende nævnt som en stor udfordring. Bøndernes forum foreslog, at der skulle organiseres træning, så bønderne bliver bedre til at beregne omkostninger og fastsætte priser.



Den vigtigste lære af de erfaringer, man har gjort indtil videre, er, at bøndernes forum skal gå fuldt og helt ind for at organisere markederne og koncentrere indsatserne. Det anbefales kraftigt, at alle bønder involveres, så man sikrer succes og undgår misforståelser. Fremover skal der afsættes flere resurser til at promovere markederne, så alle parter deltager, nemlig bønderne, handelsmænd, tilsynsførende, leverandører osv.

Projektet støttede bøndernes forum med at arrangere møder, skabe opmærksomhed gennem medier, udarbejde reklame materiale, telte og træning.

Army speaks on 'coup' claims

THE Lesotho Defence Force (LDF) has dismissed allegations it is planning to stage a *coup d'état* in the event that the current government loses the parliamentary elections scheduled for Saturday next week. The assurance comes in the wake of swirling speculation the LDF was preparing to unleash terror if their "favoured political parties" were not elected in the upcoming polls. The speculation was ignited by a request the LDF commander, Lieutenant-General Khoantle Motšomotšo, made to the commissioner of lands to avail 22 areas that include hills and plateaus in the country for the army.

The areas concerned are in all the country's 10 districts and include Thabana-Ntlenyana, Thaba-Phafane, Qeme Plateau, Machache, Qoaling Plateau, Lion Rock, Pela-Tšoeu, Phatla-Khomo, Mokotjomela, Thaba-Ntšo, Nkokobé, Mamalapi, Maseephó, Thamathu, Tšepeng, Baneising, Kalime, Thaba-Tšoeu, Leqooa, Qhaliseng, Mok'hopha and Thaba-Mokhele.

The *Lesotho Times* is in possession of Lt-Gen Motšomotšo's letter of request to the commissioner of lands.

Part of the letter, dated 6 March 2017, reads: "Lesotho Defence Force is kindly requesting your good office to secure the below tabulated Hills and Plateaus, for the Ground of Tactical Importance (GTI).

"They will be used for foreseeable security threat and security purposes.

"Lesotho Defence Force is aware of the community around and also (sic) retains of the developments."

The timing of the request, which was made soon after the passing of a parliamentary no-confidence vote on Prime Minister Pakalitha Mosisili's government on 1 March 2017, has raised the eyebrows of the opposition and critics of the regime.

The no-confidence vote was sponsored by the All Basotho Convention (ABC), Alliance of Democrats (AD) Basotho National Party and Reformed Congress of Lesotho (RCL) cutting short the five-year tenure of the government which was formed in March 2015.

The opposition has also pointed to the fact that the request was made on 6 March 2017, the day King Letsie III dissolved parliament at the advice of Dr Mosisili to pave the way for the setting of the election date.

Basotho National Party (BNP) spokesperson, Machesetsa Mofomobe, yesterday told this publication concerns about the security situation in the country ahead of the elections "should not be taken lightly in light of the army's machinations". He said it was "common knowledge" that the army preferred the outgoing seven-party governing coalition to the opposition parties.

Apart from Dr Mosisili's Democratic Congress, the outgoing governing coalition consists of the Lesotho Congress for Democracy (LCD), Marematlou Freedom Party, Basotho Congress Party, National Independent Party, Lesotho People's Congress and Popular Front for Democracy.

The parties cobbled Lesotho's second coalition government on 4 March 2015 after the 28 February 2015 general election had resulted in a hung parliament.

Mr Mofomobe said the LDF's request to occupy strategic places ahead of the elections was suspicious "given their track record".

The BNP spokesperson cited the LDF's raid on three key Maseru police stations on the morning of 30 August 2014 as the reason for the concern.

The raid, which left one police officer dead, triggered a chain of unsavoury events that led to the collapse of the Thomas Thabane-led coalition government and intervention by the international community in an effort to avert a complete breakdown of the rule of law in Lesotho.

Ramaphosa to Visit Lesotho Ahead of June Elections

The Southern African Development Community (SADC) facilitator, Deputy President Cyril Ramaphosa is on Tuesday expected to visit Lesotho ahead of the country's elections in June, the presidency has said in a statement.

Ramaphosa's visit was in pursuance of decisions taken by heads of state and government at the SADC summit in Swaziland in March.

Lesotho was scheduled to hold general elections on June 3.



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Ramaphosa and the SADC Oversight Committee were mandated to "conduct a multi-stakeholder national dialogue before the elections of 3 June, with the aim of building consensus and trust among all stakeholders and charting the way forward for the implementation of SADC decisions".

Ramaphosa was set to meet with his majesty King Letsie III, Prime Minister Phakalitha Mosisili, the Independent Electoral Commission, opposition political party leaders, churches and civil society.

Lesotho plunged into a political crisis following the 2014 failed coup attempt by an army general.
